UNESCO has partnered up with ICDE, Commonwealth of Learning and INQAAHE for the initiative: International Conference on Quality Assurance: Achieving Sustainable Development through a diverse provision of Higher Education, to be held at UNESCO Head Quarter in Paris, June 2018. To prepare and mobilise for this comprehensive conference, 6 – 10 regional meetings will be organised in the period late 2016 – 2018 in cooperation with so-called Focal Points of Quality.

EADTU has been appointed as ICDE Focal Point on Quality for Europe, with support of FIED, SADE and OUUK, and will have a leading and coordinating role for quality work in Europe.

DelRett.no advisory service on copyright



Norwegian Agency for Digital Learning in Higher Education recently relaunched DelRett.no, an advisory service on copyright issues in education.

The purpose of the site is to help ensure that copyright issues do not hinder the development, use and sharing of digital learning resources. The aim has been to make educators more confident

about copyright issues. To this end, the site offers easily accessible and user-oriented information about copyright. With this relaunch, new guides are available for both professors and students.

DelRett is developed in cooperation with Norwegian Centre for ICT in Education and thus covers both primary and higher education.

Can In-Video interaction extend the attention span of learners?

A research conducted at the Open University of Israel investigates the impact of adding interactive components to lecture videos. This unique experiment is based on nationwide MOOCs which were developed in order to make "English for Academic Purposes" courses freely available for all Israeli students.



"This study demonstrated the potential of learning analytics to identify ways to improve learning processes, and to provide important insights to decision makers. The ability to track and analyse behaviour of learners who are presented with new features and capabilities is paramount for improving the effectiveness of learning environments, as well as supporting productive allocation of resources." Our long term mission is to improve the understanding of how interactive online video lectures might narrow the gap between weak and strong learners and allow better social inclusion.

JYU open university education record: 100 000 ECTS reached

For the first time in its history the open university education of University of Jyväskylä has reached more than 100 000 ECTS

completed by students in 2016. That is a 27 % share of completed ECTS in the whole Finland, making the University of Jyväskylä the most popular open university education provider in Finland. The university has broken its credit records for 5 years in a row. The director of the Open University, Jukka Lerkkanen, says the secret behind the success is flexibility. The students have the possibility to start their studies whenever and wherever it's most suitable for them.

New UNESCO-chair of Open Education



Recently, Prof. Dr. Marco Kalz has been appointed as UNESCO Chair of Open Education. The chair from the Open University of the Netherlands will investigate the access to (higher) education using digital technologies.

The chair has a special focus on the socio-economic and cultural dimension of open education. According to Marco Kalz "Technology offers opportunities, but at the same time we need to keep in mind that we are losing sight of people who are less computer-based or who have less access to ICT". In addition, special attention is paid to the importance of Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) as a basic knowledge infrastructure to solve the greatest social problems of this time.

Christian M. Stracke appointed as ICDE Chair



The International Council for Open and Distance Education (ICDE) has appointed Christian M. Stracke as ICDE Chair in Open Educational Resources (OER). "This appointment from such a leading international association is a great honour which I am delighted to accept in recognition of my activities and achievements for Open Education", says Christian who has been working as Associate Professor for Open Education in the Open University's Welten Institute for the past 2 years.

Christian is looking forward to exploring new opportunities in his new role as one of the 8 International ICDE chairs in OER and says that he is already planning "new initiatives for Open Education policies and OER authoring systems in close cooperation with ICDE".

DCU-Fuse



At the end of March, Dublin City University (DCU) embarked on an innovative digital learning initiative, which saw the university's staff, students, alumni and key stakeholders take part in an online discussion to help shape the next phase of the university's development. DCU Fuse was a 24 hour online envisioning and consultation process, including a number of special VIP guests from around the world such as Dr. George Siemens, to gather ideas on some of the opportunities and challenges facing higher education in the future. The conversation coincided with Open Education Week and was open to university's 17,000 students, 1,200 staff and 80,000 graduates and members of the wider public. Over the 24 hour period there were around 70,000 page views, almost 6,000 discussion posts over 7,000 likes and DCU–Fuse trended as high as number 2 on Twitter. The 7 Deadly Sins of Online Learning



In April, Professor Mark Brown, Director of the National Institute of Digital Learning (NIDL) at Dublin City University (DCU) gave an invited keynote presentation at the Online Learning Consortium's OLC Innovate Conference in New Orleans. The conference attracted over 1,200 delegates with Mark's opening presentation exploring the 7 deadly sins of online in terms of structural innovation. After his presentation Mark was interviewed by EdSurge and in the following article shares how educational leaders may be able to avoid or repent from many of these sins. His key point is the importance of creating an institutional culture which fosters innovation in the context of online learning.
